Debates about global law often oscillate between two extremes: a return to unqualified local sovereignty or the creation of a fully centralized world authority. Both positions oversimplify the range of possibilities because in practice, global law is more likely to evolve through hybrid and incremental arrangements. In areas such as administration and taxation a salient question is therefore what the requirements of global regulatory law are. This question is related to the normative dimensions of global law: the existence of common goods beyond territoriality, the relevance of individual and non-State actor entitlements, the exercise of authority beyond the State, the emergence of reflexive and epistemic authorities. The workshop will focus on these issues by juxtaposing two historically State-based core regulatory areas: administration and taxation. We will use these areas as an experiment or a litmus test in the direction of an encompassing concept of “global law”.
